## Call for Proposals

Impact UDL is now seeking proposals for a conference that will provide cutting edge information on how best to apply Universal Design for Learning (UDL) and Accessibility principles to online and blended learning at the post-secondary education level.

Attendees will gain innovative knowledge via informative presentations, practical workshops, be inspired by projects and research, as well as create networks with others who want to learn, promote, and implement UDL and web accessibility.

This event will be held on January 28 to 30, 2016, at the Chateau Louis Conference Center, in Edmonton, Alberta.

## Conference Objectives

The aim of this conference is to:

- Raise institutional awareness of challenges to accessing learning in online or blended education
- Identify organizational opportunities to enhance access, enrollment and student retention
- Provide scaffolding and skills to create institutional strategies, processes, and infrastructure to implement UDL
- Showcase current initiatives, innovations and techniques used in the UDL and accessibility fields
- Facilitate the creation of networks and allow for sharing of practices and resources

## Conference Streams

There are four identified session streams.

- Teaching and Using UDL in Online or Blended Learning: provides a practical foundation in UDL principles, pedagogical impacts, assessment, evaluation using LMS data, course design and delivery
- AT/ICT: explores Assistive Technology (AT) and Information and Communication Technology (ICT) trends and accessibility issues that impact students, document digitization and IT infrastructure.
- Tech Talk: dives into industry guidelines and techniques to create and evaluate accessibility of web properties, mobile platforms, LMS and ICT projects including development, design and coding
- Leadership: focuses on implementation and institutional changes such as infrastructure, staff engagement, accessibility vs. accommodation approaches, policies and legislation guiding accessibility in Canada
